Did you know that in prehistory much of California was under water? Can you imagine pygmy mammoths living on Santa Rosa Island, or what it would be like to be the first European to see California? Learning from the past can inspire our future. Santa Barbara is the

home of many historical "firsts," including Flying-A movie studios, which made hundreds of silent films from 1917 to 1920. The very first Ferragamo shoe store in the U.S. opened on State Street. And, believe it or not, the Egg Mc-Muffin was invented here in 1971! Santa Barbara was home to



the world's first official Earth Day Celebration. These and so many more historic events will be illustrated in the 4 foot tall and 50 foot long Timeline Mosaic.

Unite our Diverse Residents and Educate Our Youth

The Santa Barbara Timeline Mosaic will be a highly visual and artistic way to learn about our environment and the diverse cultures that make Santa Barbara what it is today. In consultation with Sonos, an audio component will allow visitors to access more information about the images depicted in the mosaic and encourage curiosity about sciences such as geology, paleontology and anthropology.

Build a Legacy and Inspire Future Generations

The Santa Barbara Timeline Mosaic will be an iconic public art project made to withstand the test of time. Our tiles are the same tiles used in subways in France. They are easy to maintain and built to last. The mosaic will be created by the hands of community volunteers, who can say "I was part of that! I placed those tiles." Future generations will learn from and enjoy the art created by their families and friends. New panels can be added as our present becomes our past and our children want to tell their stories too.

The Artist

Betsy Gallery was educated as an Art Therapist. She studied mosaics in Ravenna and Venice, Italy, Cuernavaca, Mexico, and the Institute of
